Disaster Services and Service to Armed Forces/Communication

- Disaster Services assisted 26 families, helping 73 people.
- Service to Armed Forces assisted 35 families with communications to deployed military family members.



Patient Direct Services

- Cancer Patient Services biggest accomplishment is celebrating our 70 year anniversary in 2016. CPS has served cancer patients in Hancock County since 1946. We were also one of the first partner agencies of the United Way in 1956, a Red Feather Society member. We are proud of our long standing commitment to the community and those affected by cancer



Advocate Recruiting, Training and Support

- In 2015, CASA volunteers served 280 children.
- Volunteer advocates provided over 15,000 work hours on those cases.
- They traveled 6,240 miles. They participated in 784 hours of training. CASA staff engaged in 9,240 hours of support services.



Peer to Peer Program

- Century Health was able to provide intensive peer support services to clients who needed it. 20 clients received over 50 hours of service per client.
- Peer support services are now an integral part of the Hancock County Common Pleas drug court and Tree Line Recovery Center. Both of these programs started in 2015 and peer support staff is heavily involved. Our peer support specialists provided 3,573 hours of services to clients in need. In addition, the Basu Point peer support staff is available daily to an average of 15 tenants.



Therapeutic Riding Program

- At Challenged Champions we are honored to be able to serve the members of our community with special needs. It is an amazing feeling being able to witness first hand the accomplishments of our participants, and the reactions of their families when they achieve their goals. It is not easy to put into words the profound impact this program has on the lives of not only the participants, but also their families, the volunteers and instructors as well. We are extremely proud that our veterans program has finally taken off this past year. It has been, and continues to be, a process to reach out to veterans that qualify for our program. This past year we were able to serve over 20 veterans at Challenged Champions, with some veterans coming from as far away as Detroit. These veterans have said that there are not many programs or opportunities for them to participate in locally, which is why they make the drive to our facility. Our veterans have told us that Horses for Veterans means so much to them and they appreciate the opportunity to participate.



Patient Direct Services/Education

On average four volunteers assist in the office for day-to-day operations, patient services and fundraising. We couldn't assist as many patients without their help!



Adult Victim Services, Children Services and Violence Recovery Program

- Provided emergency shelter and comprehensive assistance to 42 adults, equaling 1,796 days of care.
- Assisted 855 adults through support groups, court accompaniment, and medical advocacy.
- Responded to 485 crisis calls on our 24 hour crisis hotline.
- Reached out to 2,246 people in Hancock County through group presentations and our community education and awareness efforts.
