

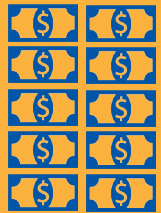

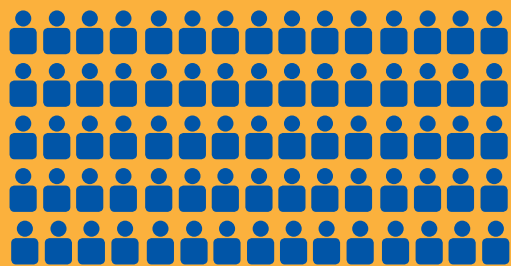

THIS YEAR UNITED WAY IS FUNDING 32 PROGRAMS THAT IMPROVE LIVES.

Open Arms Violence Recovery Project engaged 146 individuals in offender programming designed to change the patterns of violent behaviors towards family members.

The Findlay Hope House for the Homeless shelter continues to have an average 85% success rate for women moving into and maintaining self-sufficiency after staying at the shelter.



HATS has provided 18 years of quality public transit service. United Way funding has been there since the beginning. In the past five years HATS has logged 210,284 trips. HATS contributes to the economy by providing trips to or from work. The second highest are trips for medical care which positively impacts the health of residents.

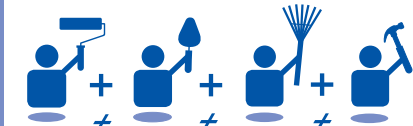

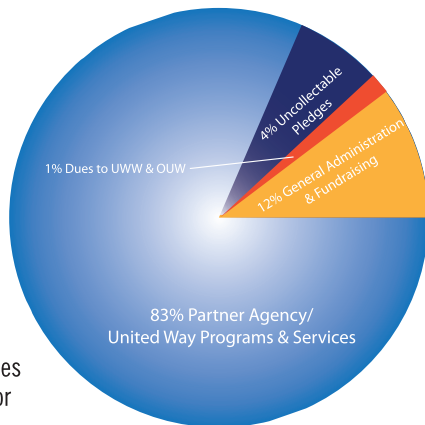

WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO?

Of all money raised by United Way of Hancock County:

- 99% stays in Hancock County or is designated by the contributor to another United Way.
- 83% is used for programs and services in Hancock County, or another community if designated. In 2016, we distributed \$2,545,087 to local agencies to provide these important services.



Further breakdown:

- 4% is uncollected. This means someone leaves their job, retires or doesn't follow through with their pledge.
- 1% is used for dues to Ohio United Way (OUW) and United Way Worldwide (UWW). Our membership in these organizations provides our United Way with resources, branding, marketing support and more.
- 12% is used for general administrative needs like salaries, overhead for our space and expenses to run United Way of Hancock County. The Better Business Bureau suggests that nonprofit organizations spend no more than 35% on general administration and fundraising.
